# TECHNICAL-SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE OF THE 1<sup>ST</sup> INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF CONSCIENTIOLOGY, 2024: DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT

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## INTRODUCTION

**Contextualization.** The Congress began to be conceived within the scope of the *Interscientific Council* of the *Union of International Conscientiocentric Institutions* (UNICIN), years before its completion, based on the group's maturation with the experiences of holding the *Conscientiology Parascientific Weeks*, which began to be held annually in 2014.

**Focus.** This report, due to the very nature of the activity, focuses on strictly describing the actions and *modus faciendi* of the technical-scientific team of the pioneering mega-event of the *International Cosmoethical Conscientiological Community* (ICCC) to be held in Foz do Iguaçu, State of Parana, Brazil, from July 22-28, 2024.

**Objective.** The purpose of this document is to share the experiences and methodologies used in the process of receiving, checking, selecting, and disclosing of the works selected, forwarding them to the *Conscientia* magazine team, which then produced the appropriate reviews and proceeded to publish the *Proceedings*, in addition to providing guidance to the authors of the papers produced for their presentations at the event.

**Relevance.** The authors of this report considered relevant sharing this process with the readers, taking into account its technical-scientific nature, evidencing the transparency with which the work has been carried out, and equally inspire other teams of similar future events.

**Call.** The *Call for Papers* (Annex I) was prepared by the organizing committee in five languages: Portuguese, English, Spanish, German, and French.

**Committee.** After forwarding the *Call for Papers*, the General Coordinator of the Congress, Alexandre Zaslavsky, put together the Technical-Scientific Committee, inviting the members who became part of it, namely: Nilse Oliveira (coordinator), Izilda Fresiansd, Ana Seno, Maurício Bottino, and Andrêssa Lima, authors of this report.

**Presentation.** The descriptions, listed in eight subject blocks, follow the chronological sequence in which the activities were initiated or carried out:

- 1. **Premise:** antecedent to the work described in the following sections.
- 2. **Peer-reviewing:** creation of criteria, semi-automated guiding spreadsheets, and selection of peer-reviewers.
- 3. **Reception and Assignment of Works:** organization of the flow of reception of works submitted, assignment to peer-reviewers, and respective feedback from them.

- 4. **Collection of results:** compilation of peer-reviews, automated spreadsheets creation to visually facilitate cross-check of reviews and classify papers.
- 5. **Disclosure:** informing the entire ICCC about the works selected, as well as all authors who submitted work.
- 6. **Congress Program:** creation of the methodology for establishing a program and timetable, in consensus with the other Congress committees.
- 7. **Publication and Translation:** forwarding the papers for publication, and for translation into the English language, for the *Proceedings of the 1<sup>st</sup> ICC*.
- 8. **Interaction with Authors:** communication with authors on the results of their submissions and guidance for their presentations.

**Annexes.** At the end, the annexes mentioned throughout the explanations of the eight sections are attached.

## I. PREMISE

**Antecedent.** Before the arrival of the papers, the committee began the preparations, following four guidelines in logical sequence, sent by the general coordinator with UNICIN and the partner CI to carry out the work, the *International Association of the Centre for the Higher Studies of Conscientiology* (CEAEC):

- 1. **Invited speakers:** due to the history of scientific contribution in conscientiology specialties, nine researchers have been invited to hold lectures at the Congress. Among them, a renowned, international consciousness researcher, not directly associated with conscientiology. In these cases, the approval was direct for presentation at the Congress and their papers sent directly for revision to be published in the *Proceedings of 1<sup>st</sup> ICCC*, in special issues of the *Conscientia* magazine.
- 2. **Double-blind:** peer-review evaluation and classification of submitted papers would be carried out using a double-blind system, in which reviewers do not know the authors of the papers evaluated and vice-versa, the authors would not have information about the reviewers of their papers.
- 3. **Types of Papers:** in addition to the lectures of invited speakers, the Congress was set to include roundtables, mini-lectures, and panels, to make the most as many works as those approved as adequate.
- 4. **Periodical:** for the publication of the works, it would be negotiated primarily with *Conscientia* magazine, a conscientiological periodical that included in its previous editions works presented in previous *Conscientiology Parascientific Weeks*.

**Beginning.** With the above four items, the organizing committee outlined methodologies for the work, held meetings/negotiations with the *Conscientia* magazine team, previous technical-scientific teams, including the coordinators of the *International Congress of Projectiology* (CIPRO), with the authors Nilse Oliveira and Izilda Fresiansd deciding not to submit papers to the 1<sup>st</sup> *International Congress of Conscientiology* as they assumed the functions of interacting via e-mail with authors and peer-reviewers.

## II. PEER-REVIEWING

**Criteria.** The criteria adopted to evaluate the works received considered the guidelines already expressed in the *Call for Papers* text (Annex I), as well as adding fields for referees-peer-reviewers' notes.

**Spreadsheet.** A Peer-review Spreadsheet (Annex II) was prepared for peer-reviewers to record scores and comments on the papers evaluated under each of the criteria adopted. This *Excel* spreadsheet contained guidelines for its completion and was prepared in a standardized way (name and content) to facilitate the automation of results calculation.

**Content.** The Peer-review Spreadsheet relied on the following five criteria, listed below in the descending order of the weight attributed to them:

- 1. **Alignment with the** *Call for Papers*: materthosene, objectives, and consistent thematic axes.
- 2. **Scientificity:** scientific language, argumentation, principle of disbelief, theorice, and bibliography.
- 3. **Originality:** new approaches, association of ideas, creativity, verponogeny, and neoconcepts.
- 4. Conscientiality: consciential paradigm, interassistance, strongtraitist approach, and universalism.
- 5. Conformatics: conscientiological technicality, elements, and consistent organization of the text.

**Quantity.** Each work received, whether in the form of a paper, account, or abstract, was submitted to three peer-reviewers who, in addition to not being aware of who the authors were, had no information about the other two peer-reviewers evaluating the same work.

**Invitations.** Volunteers experienced in reviewing scientific papers and specialists from various areas of conscientiology were invited to peer-reviewing, making a total of 87 names, of which 14 declined the invitation due to time-unavailability to meet the required deadlines.

**Assessment.** A guidance document was prepared for the evaluators, and online explanatory meetings were held on the variables and criteria to be observed in the reading and evaluation of the works. The adoption of a spreadsheet with scores by group of criteria facilitated peer-review standardization, comments inclusion, and summarizing the evaluation of each work.

**Guidance.** Peer-review work was detailed in online meetings with each reviewer to explain the spreadsheet and how to fill it out. The recording of this meeting was later shared with all peer-reviewers.

#### III. RECEPTION AND ASSIGNMENT OF WORKS

**Arrival.** The submitted texts were received via the email informed in the *Call for Papers*, only by two Committee members, Nilse Oliveira and Izilda Fresiansd, who adopted the following four steps, in sequential order:

- 1. **Confirmation.** Confirmed receipt, informing the author(s) that the work would be submitted to the peer-reviewers, in the double-blind system.
- 2. **Folder.** A folder was created in *Google Drive*, with access possible only to the general coordinator of the Congress, in addition to the two above members of the Committee.
- 3. **Acronym.** Files received were named with acronyms, with one letter accompanied by random numbers, the letter indicating the type of text: paper or abstract.
- 4. **Decharacterization.** Texts and files were decharacterized, removing data on the ownership of the files, authors' names, mini-resumes, e-mail, and other data in the text that could indicate the senders.

**Sending.** Send to peer-reviewers followed the four criteria listed below in alphabetical order:

- 1. **Codes.** Codes were created for the peer-reviewers to avoid recognition between peers and thus guarantee double-blindness, adopting the letter P, followed by random numbers, whose criterion was known *only* by the two above mentioned committee members responsible for the process.
- 2. **Criteria.** Forwarding of each of the works to three reviewers, observing the following restrictions: not two partners in the same evolutionary duo, and not having any known close relationship between the three reviewers, or between them and the authors of the work that would be evaluated.
- 3. **Data.** A general spreadsheet was created, with the minimum data, but including the codes of the texts and the reviewers to whom they had been sent. To access this spreadsheet, a password was created, known only to the two committee members involved in the sending.
- 4. **Deadlines.** In the sending email, a return deadline was requested to comply with the general schedule. In case of impossibility of the reviewer to meet the return on the stipulated date, another reviewer with availability was sought.

## IV. COLLECTION OF RESULTS

**Spreadsheet.** A Triple Peer-review Spreadsheet (Annex III) was prepared that automatically imported all the information from the three Peer-review Spreadsheets for each work evaluated to facilitate results calculation.

**Compilation.** A Calculation Spreadsheet (Annex IV) was also prepared, which automatically imported the information from the Triple Peer-review Spreadsheets of all the works evaluated and consolidated the most important information to assist in the calculation of the results.

**Procedures.** The way in which all data was compiled ensured confidentiality in the procedures for both peer-reviewers and authors. Only two people on the committee knew the authorial identification and, following the distribution criteria, sent works to reviewers.

**Meetings.** After the evaluations were completed, several committee meetings with the general coordinator were held to determine the classification and final selection of the works. Those meetings sometimes extended until late at night, to guarantee on-time delivery, objectivity, and precision in the best decision to choose texts.

**Selection.** Approval and selection for Roundtable, Mini-lecture, or Panel modalities followed the scores, comments, and opinions of the three peer-reviewers, taking into account the consonance and coherence expressed in the evaluations carried out. In the few cases one of the reviewers differed from the other two, the submitted text was analyzed during the meetings, to conclude the results.

**Tiebreaker.** In the event of a tie regarding Average Weighted Final Grade of the works, tiebreaker parameters were the same evaluation criteria used in the opinions, that is: Alignment with the Call for Papers, Scientificity, Originality, Conscientiality, and Conformatics.

Classification. In the end, 75 works were classified, 38 for Roundtables, 24 for Panels, and 13 Mini-lectures.

# V. DISCLOSURE

**Challenge.** A considerable part of a scientific congress' organization depends on the information and quantity of the selected works. Thus, the Technical-Scientific Committee had the challenge of organizing, distributing the work received, receiving the peer-reviews, closing the final selection, and announcing it within the deadline agreed with the Organizing Committee.

**Deadline.** Between reception deadline and disclosure date, the Technical-Scientific Committee had 6 weeks to carry out the activities described with 108 works received.

**Live.** Wide publicity was carried out at the ICCC for the live announcement of the selected works, which took place on 20/12/2023; was record and is available on the CEAEC channel (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=W8C6LAPNsjY">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=W8C6LAPNsjY</a>), with the aim of disclosing the three technical-scientific aspects of the 1<sup>st</sup> International Congress of Conscientiology, in logical order:

- 1. **Figures:** presentation of the figures: total number of works received; total number of reviewers; number of works selected for Mini-lectures, Roundtables, and Panels.
- 2. **Methodology:** explanation of double-blind approach in evaluating the works to ensure the quality of each contribution; the evaluation of each work done by three peer-reviewers; and alignment with the Call for Papers criteria.
- 3. **Selection:** disclosure of authors and works selected for Panels, Roundtables, and Mini-lectures, in that order, alphabetically presented by title.

**Congratulations.** The live was also an opportunity for the Congress organization to congratulate everyone who sent work, express gratitude for receiving a record number of papers ever recorded for a conscientiological scientific event this far, and to invite the entire ICCC to participate in this parahistorical conscientiological event.

**Repercussion.** It is worth mentioning the positive repercussion on the social networks of CIs and volunteers with the dissemination of the selected works. The diversity of specialties present in the 75 works selected shows the cosmovision of conscientiological scientificity underlying the event's program.

**Confidentiality.** The entire ranking and selection task was carried out in complete confidentiality; only the two committee members responsible for coding the works knew who the authors and peer-reviewers were. It was only two days before the live broadcast of the results to the entire ICCC that all team members became aware of the selected works, as there was a need to prepare a few slides.

## VI. CONGRESS PROGRAM

**Strategy.** The event schedule was prepared, and it was decided to group subjects to highlight the themes and specialties of the works submitted. The strategy was to adopt content affinity approaches, considering the criteria of scientificity and originality.

**Order.** This strategy favoured the chronological sequence of the presentations, with interconnected thematic groups created for each day of the event between tables, mini-lectures, and lectures, making it possible to give titles to the roundtables.

**Distribution.** Due to the amount of works approved, the maximum use of the days reserved for the Congress was sought, thus Congress and CEAEC Coordinators decided to also use CEAEC rooms, next to the event hotel, with simultaneous presentations in both locations, as stated in the Congress Program (Annex VI).

**Workshops.** In addition to the lectures by invited researchers those selected originating in the Call for Papers, the *Interscientific Council*, through the coordinators Alexandre Zaslavsky and Izilda Fresiansd, invited the *Conscientiocentric Institutions* (CIs) to provide practical workshops on the respective specialties, related to parascientific technicality. The proposals received were evaluated, and eleven were selected and given a slot

in the three days up to the event. These activities are open to people enrolling to participate in the Congress in presential mode.

**Panels.** Titles and authors of the works selected for Panels are not mentioned on the Congress Timetable leaflet, but the information is available in Annex V – Listing of Panels and Authors (in alphabetical order).

## VII. PUBLICATION AND TRANSLATIONS

**Proceedings.** The forwarding for publication with the *Proceedings of the 1*<sup>st</sup> *International Congress of Conscientiology*, two special editions of the magazine *Conscientia* completely dedicated to the congress was carried out following the disclosure of results, making the files of what had been agreed to be published available: lectures and mini-lectures.

**Observation.** Considering the deadline unfeasible for the flow of reviews and other preparations to publish all those selected papers in the Annals to be made available on the date of the event, since the possibilities for the magazine was 20, it was decided to publish only the papers referring to lectures and mini-lectures. The other authors were notified, remaining open for submission in future publications.

**Revision.** Revision of the papers was carried out observing the conformity criteria by the magazine team, who interacted directly with the authors.

**Publishing.** Layout, electronic availability, preparation, and interaction with printers was the magazine's editorial team responsibility, following standard procedures.

**Translation.** As the works were being finalized by the magazine's team, they were made available for translation to a team mostly constituted by volunteers of the *Interassistantial Services for the Internationalization of Conscientiology* (ISIC), under the coordination of researcher Liliana Alexandre, responsible for the translation revision of the Congress materials.

**Supplement.** Besides the magazine's special edition with Congress lectures and mini-lectures, this supplement in English will be published containing the full translation of the Portuguese edition.

## VIII. INTERACTION WITH AUTHORS

**Communication.** To interact with the authors, the Congress committee created a dedicated email, which for this purpose was signed on behalf of the Technical-Scientific Committee. Here are the four situations in which the interactions were carried out, in functional order:

- 1. **Acknowledgement of reception.** Acknowledging the work was received.
- 2. **Result.** Communication of results and peer-review comments to all, regardless of approval and classification of work.
- 3. **Slides.** Guidance for the preparation of slides for the presentation, following the Congress Executive and Communication Committees' guidelines. These procedures were carried out by block, following the type of participation: lectures, mini-lectures, roundtables, and panels.
  - 4. Others. Punctual clarification of doubts and other comments received.

**Upload.** The authors were instructed to upload the slides in specific folders in which only those interested and volunteers involved with reception, preparation, translations, and revisions of the presentations have access.

## FINAL CONSIDERATIONS

**Synthesis.** The paragraphs below summarize the achievements of conscientiological scientificity, explained in the historical event of the  $1^{st}$  International Congress of Conscientiology held by the International Cosmoethical Conscientiological Community (ICCC).

## Figures:

- **108 papers submitted** (record number of submissions for scientific events in conscientiology).
- **73 peer-reviewers** (ensuring 3 for each work submitted, in the double-blind system).
- **38 papers presented in Roundtables** (distributed in 11 thematic groups of 3 or 4 papers).
- **24 works selected to be displayed in Panels** (banners displayed at the event site).
- 13 papers classified as Minilectures.
- 9 Guest lecturers.
- 11 Complementary workshops.

**Achievement.** The event was held simultaneously in the in-person and online modalities, and three months before its start (Base-date: 25/04/2024), there were 145 participants enrolled, 120 of which able to participate in-person.

**Team.** This information contains a brief description of the activities carried out by the Technical-Scientific Committee. The Congress also included other committees that carried out the preparations and operationalization of the activities, counting with numerous conscientiology volunteers from various CIs participating directly or indirectly, making impractical to mention them all, besides the CEAEC teams, especially the *Conscientia* magazine, who contributed extensively.

**Organization.** Annex VII includes the names of those who initially proposed the Project and supported the idea of the Congress, preparing, planning, and carrying out specific activities, and updating themselves regularly for the well over 12 months of intense work to develop the event.

#### I. DEFINITION

#### The 1st International Congress of Conscientiology

is a comprehensive supra-institutional scientific event bringing to all in the ICCC the state-of-the art overview on the scientificity of all research and the scientificity of all conscientiology's specialties. This dissemination is certainly most relevant to all interested parties.

#### II. PRESENTATION

The 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the treatise 700 Conscientiology Experiments (1994) hence constitutes the ideal opportunity for an assessment of conscientiology as a science. The quantitative accumulation of publications, exceeding 12,000 items (ICGE, 2022), makes it possible for qualitative studies on the specialties to be carried out by the team, allowing it to move towards theoretical and methodological consensus, as per the Specialty Research Programme, based on the consciential paradigm and on The Principle of Disbelief.

The 1\* International Congress of Conscientiology aims to bring together the need and opportunity for qualitative surveys, establishing markers for measuring how conscientiological scientificity has advanced, both in terms of results achieved and future projects, in tune with the group maxiproexis. Obtaining a broad overview of conscientiological scientificity is establishing and comparing syntheses. The event and the panel offer a 'cosmoramic' view of conscientiological scientificity achieved over these three decades.

#### III. OBJECTIVES

General: Obtain an overview of the scientificity already achieved by conscientiology. Specific:

- Establish interrelationships between research in different specialties.
- Promote the structuring and systemization of specialties.
- Foster the interaction and synergism of conscientiological research and publications.
- Provide conditions for verifiability of conscientiological knowledge.

#### IV. MATERTHOSENE

Cosmovision of conscientiological scientificity.

#### Thematic Axes

- Development of specialties: the structuring of research programs.
- Epistemological and paraepistemological bases: methodologies, techniques, and research instruments / tools; theoretical foundations.
- Interparadigmatic dialogues: area debates, including invited external researchers interested in the objectives of this Congress.
- History of Conscientiology: chronologies of projects, institutions, and knowledge; prospects, future macro-projects; parahistoriographology; and holomemoriology.

#### SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

Papers need follow these guidelines:

- Identification sheet: title, name and surname of the author, co-authors, mini-curriculum (education; profession; volunteering institution(s), contact email, and phone.
- Elements: maximum of 4,500 words. Abstract (up to 150 words).
- Formatting: Microsoft Word document, or compatible software; A4 format; font: Times New Roman, font size 12; 1.5 interlining.
- 4) Keywords: 3 to 6.
- 5) References: BEE standard or APA standard.
- Languages: Portuguese, English, and Spanish.


